## Traffic Training Session in TEP

Nashik First organizes “Road Safety Traffic Awareness” workshops for all school students from std. 5 to std. 10 and adults (Rickshaw Drivers, Bus Drivers, Employees from Banks, Offices & Industries, etc.) to bring awareness about traffic rules and road safety.

### **Training Sessions conducted during the Financial Year 2019-20.**

Since the inception, we have trained 1,33, 309 students & adults in 2589 sessions. During FY 2019-20, a total of 783 sessions were organized in which 42,298 participants were present.

### **Simulator Training and Counseling on Road Safety & Traffic awareness programme jointly organized by RTO and Nashik First**

In an initiative by Nashik First and RTO Nashik, the RTO issued a circular for granting permanent license only after undergoing Counseling, Simulator Training on Road Safety & Traffic Awareness programme for two hours at Traffic Education Park, for youth aged 18 to 25 yrs.

We have trained 33685 applicants of Permanent License, till March 2020 in 577 sessions, free of cost.

## **School Bus Driver Training by Nashik First and RTO, Nashik**

Nashik First collaborated with RTO to train School Bus Drivers on defensive, safe and disciplined driving of school buses along with taking proper care of students. The School Bus Drivers Training was launched on 19<sup>th</sup> April 2018 at TEP.

We have trained 1814 Bus drivers in 38 sessions free of cost so far.

## **Road Safety counseling for suspended Driving license holders**

According to the directions given by the Supreme Court, the Regional Transport Office (RTO) of Nashik started counseling session on Road Safety at Traffic Education Park.

By the directions of the Supreme Court, the decision of Committee on Road Transport (CORS), as per rule no. 21 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, and in accordance with Rule no. 21 of the Central Motor Vehicles Rules, 1989, it was declared that the driving licenses of traffic rule offenders would be suspended for at least three months if the following 6 offenses were made:

1. Drinking & Driving,
2. Talking on Mobile phone while driving,
3. Jumping traffic signals,
4. Over-speeding,
5. Carrying passengers in goods carrier vehicle and
6. Driving over loaded vehicles.

We have conducted 8 counseling sessions covering 175 participants. Certificates were given to these participants after getting assurance from them for following traffic rules. The counseling sessions were conducted by Mr. Shrikant Karode.

## **RSP & RSAP Training**

Nashik First and Hero MotoCorp Ltd. (HMCL) jointly started the Ride Safe Awareness Programme (RSAP) and Ride Safe Programme (RSP) to train citizens of Nashik on defensive, safe and disciplined driving with two wheelers. This facility was launched on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2018. We have a Two-wheeler as well as a Car Driving Simulator in the Traffic Park to strengthen our training facility. This training is provided upon prior booking for 2 hours from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm.

To prevent road accidents, theoretical and practical training is rendered to the participants. In the theoretical session, information is given about road safety, causes of accidents, signals, road signs & road markings. In the practical session, warm up exercises, riding gear, pre-ride checks, mounting & dismounting procedures, riding postures with warm-up rounds are explained in detail. Practical demonstrations are shown to understand braking techniques, riding on bumpy / rough roads, balancing on narrow paths and negotiating the slalom. Participants for RSP riding must have a valid license and apt attire. They perform the above skills under the supervision of our instructors. In RSAP, participants only watch the demonstrations given by our instructors. They do not participate in practice sessions.

This year, we conducted 4 RSP & RSAP sessions in which 44 participants were present

Nashik First donated three Wheelchairs to Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation for the specially handicapped passenger's facility in view of their slogan 'Passenger Service'.

So far, we have trained more than 1 lakh people in road safety training at Traffic Education Park. On this occasion, Mr. Maind, Divisional Controller said that this initiative will surely benefit all citizens. So far, Nashik First has imparted Road Safety training to 900 ST drivers. This will surely benefit them as well as the passengers. To strengthen social commitment and gratitude towards MSRTC, Nashik First has donated three Wheel chairs. This might be the first initiative in Maharashtra. Nashik First is always known for its initiative in imparting Road safety training and solving the traffic issues of the city, but now it will also be known for its social commitment. Eight years ago, Nashik First had donated sitting benches for passengers, which is in good condition and still in use. Mr. Maind appealed that any handicapped passenger or their relative can use the wheel chair after requesting from the Control room.

Thousands of people travel along Central Bus Stand (Thakkar Bazar) and Mahamarg Bus stand. It is very difficult for a senior citizen or a handicapped passenger to reach the bus platform or to get in and out of the bus in the crowd. Considering the difficulty and problem faced by them, Nashik First decided to donate Three wheelchairs to Mr. Nitin Maind, Divisional Controller, MSRTC.

This course is designed to help a disciplined driver, so that the unemployed who want to pursue a career in this field will have a great opportunity. This course will benefit the school bus drivers, tours and tourism drivers, ST drivers, Traffic police and the drivers presently working in government sectors.

Mr. Gaurav Dharkar, member Nashik First presented the 31<sup>st</sup> Road Safety Week activities which have been planned from 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 2020 to 30<sup>th</sup> Jan 2020. Majority of the lives lost are from the age group of 18 to 25. 60% accidents in 2019 were hit and run cases. Road Safety is based on three E's- Enforcement, Engineering and Education. It should be the collective responsibility of everyone to follow the traffic rule. Enforcement is done by Police Department, Engineering is done by Municipal Corporation and Education is done by Nashik First which is really appreciable. MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving), an NGO in the United States runs to stop drunk driving. Hence, people have started following it. But if there is any change or traffic rule and fines are enforced on us then people start resisting. Traffic Management is a science and Police's top priority is to take strict action against the errant drivers, Illegal Rickshaw drivers, etc. In a city like Nashik which has a population of 19 lakhs, there are only 283 traffic constables to control the traffic."

He informed that Traffic police with the help of Architecture College is now conducting a survey of 85 places regarding divider breaks and other factors. He appealed that citizens should take care and spread awareness to keep our city healthy.



For dealing with the Social issues, a holistic approach should be adopted. He expressed his gratitude towards Nashik First for doing the commendable job of educating motorists about Road Safety.




